\$18.00 for second and subsequent dog(s) per event

\$10.50 for Listing Fee - TCN Fee for all non-CKC registered dogs

(includes 5% GST) per event

WHAT IS A SPRINTER EVENT?

The SPRINTER EVENT was introduced by the Canadian Kennel Club on July 1, 2018. The Sprinter is a fun running event open to all dogs to enjoy the challenge of running a 100 meter dash. All dogs entered will receive a handicap score based on their height. The time it takes for each dog to finish the run will be converted to kilometers per hour. Titles are awarded by the CKC upon the dog accumulating a given number of points.

ELIGIBLE PARTICIPANTS

The Sprinter Event Program participation is open to all purebred and mixed-breed dogs at least 12 months of age that are:

- Individually registered with the CKC, or
- Have an Event Registration Number (ERN), or
- Have a Performance Event Number (PEN), or
- Have a Miscellaneous Certificate Number (MSC) if it belongs to a CKC listed breed, or
- Have a Canine Companion Number (CCN) if a mixed breed, or
- Have a TCN Registration Number (TCN) if eligible for Registration Listing Fee Required.

The Sprinter is an athletic pursuit that requires your dog to be in very good condition. Your dog relies on you to ensure this. If in the opinion of the Test Committee, any entry is found to be lame, unfit to compete or a female in season, it shall not be allowed to compete, and the entry fees shall be refunded.

Dogs with Breed disqualifications are eligible to enter.

Females in season may not enter.

A dog may enter only once per test.

Dogs run single.

INSPECTION

When you arrive at the venue, please check in with the Event Secretary with your dog(s).

- Two event committee members will measure your dog to determine handicap if required.
- You will also be asked to gait your dog so that soundness can be evaluated.
- Bitches will be checked to ensure they are not in season. You will be asked to check your own dog(s)

YOUR TEAM

CKC rules state that "It is recommended that an owner or someone familiar with the dog stand at the finish line in order to catch the dog once the course has been completed". The Manitoba Gazehound Association agrees with this recommendation.

You must have a team of 2 to participate. MGA members will not be releasing/catching dogs.

EARNING POINTS

The dog's time to complete the 100 yard dash is converted into Kilometers per Hour (KPH). A handicap system is applied to a dog's KPH to determine the number of points earned. The handicap is based on the height of the dog at its withers.

18" or greater handicap is 1.25 (new 2020)

12" up to less than 18" handicap is 1.5 Below 12' handicap is 2.0

Points – KPH is multiplied by the dog's handicap. Example 20 KPH \times 1.5 = 30 points.

Points are rounded to the nearest whole number.

AWARDS

A Gold coloured qualifying ribbon will be awarded to each dog passing their test.

TITLES - REGULAR STAKES

There are four (4) titles that a dog may earn by participating in the Sprinter Event. They are:

NOVICE SPRINTER (NS)

Awarded to a dog that earns 150 points

SPRINTER (S)

Awarded to a dog that earns 500 points

ADVANCE SPRINTER (AS)

Awarded to a dog that earns 1000 points

SPRINTER EXCELLENT (SX)

Awarded to a dog that earns 1500 points

SPRINTER EXCELLENT (SX2)

Awarded to a dog that earns 2000 points

For each additional 500 points the dog may add a higher number after the SX (SX3 SX4 etc.)

NEW 2024

TITLES - VETERAN STAKES

There are four (4) titles that a dog may earn by participating in the Veteran Sprinter Event. They are:

VETERAN NOVICE SPRINTER (VNS)

Awarded to a dog that earns 75 points

VETERAN SPRINTER (VS)

Awarded to a dog that earns 250 points

VETERAN ADVANCED SPRINTER (VAS)

Awarded to a dog that earns 500 points

VETERAN SPRINTER EXCELLENT (VSX)

Awarded to a dog that earns 750 points

For each additional 250 points the dog may add a higher number after the SX (SX2 SX3 etc.)

A dog may only enter either the Veteran Stake or the Regular Stake in each event.

ATTENTION CANADIAN EXHIBITORS - INFORMATION REGARDING TITLES:

The following has been copies from the CKC website:

Attention Canadian Residents

At the December Board meeting input provided by the membership was reviewed and considered by the Board regarding the notice posted to the CKC website on November 6, 2019 regarding a New Tracking fee for non-members. The Board has made changes to the original motion approved at the September Board meeting and the following motion was passed in December and therefore the following non-member participation fee now applies and is retroactive to January 1, 2011.

The non-member participation fee applies to all Canadian residents who participate in a CKC event but are not CKC members and a participating non-member can choose to purchase a CKC membership or pay the non-member fee. This only applies to dogs wholly owned by non—members and is not applicable to CKC members or dogs co-owned with a CKC member. In order for the CKC to efficiently manage recording and tracking points. It's important that non-members select one of the two options within 30 days of notification or, unfortunately, we will be forced to cancel any awards and titles.

24-12-3. Non-member participation fee:

An annual non-member participation fee for awards and titles will be charge to a Canadian non-member of CKC. The fee will match the ERN fee

In order to protect the awards/titles earned, the non-member will have a choice either to become a CKC member or to pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will cause all awards and titles to be cancelled.

The Premium List must carry a note stating that these fees apply only to dogs wholly owned by non-CKC member and are not applicable to CKC members.

ATTENTION EXHIBITORS

- There will be a \$10.00 fine for dogs loose on the field or in the area of the event other than the dog running the course.
- Dogs will be run once per test.

- Lame dogs or bitches in season will be excused and their entry refunded, provided notice is given prior to or during roll call.
- Dogs not present at roll call shall be scratched with no refunds. No exceptions.
- Muzzles and catch collars may be used at the handler's discretion. NO FLEX LEADS, SHOCK COLLARS OR PRONG COLLARS ALLOWED.
- Catch collars must be free of any item that could become entangled in the line. All tags must be removed or secured.
- There is plenty of parking. A bathroom may be available.
- Lots of room for crates and bring shade for your dogs, a chair for yourself and plenty of water. Come Prepared.
- People are expected to clean up after their dogs. There will be a \$20.00 fine for NOT cleaning up after their dogs.
- The field is a mowed field. It is out of direct sight of roads and the actual Sprinter test site is fenced.
- No food or beverages will be provided by MGA. Please ensure you bring water for your dog and water/snacks for yourself.

DIRECTIONS TO THE FIELD.

Travelling west from Winnipeg:

Head west on Trans Canada Highway #1 towards Portage La Prairie for approximately 55 kilometers. (from west perimeter)

Turn left onto Highway 13 south. There are signs for Oakville/Carman After 2.5 kilometers turn right (west) onto Highway 331. There is a sign for Newton Park entrance is on the left-hand side (south) near the intersection
