The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred. (See Section 19.7)

No person may approach a judge either directly or otherwise, orally, in wiritng or electronically, to favour his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule, or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rul to the CKC within 14 days of the action.(Conformation Show Rules and Regulations 4.1.5.)

The Non-Member Participation Fee applies to dogs wholly owned by a resident of Canada who is not a member of the CKC; it is not applicable to CKC members or dogs co-owned with a CKC member. In order for the title to be awarded, the non-member will have a choice to either become a CKC member or pay the Non-Member Participation Fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will result in the title being withheld and the dog cannot be moved up to the next level. (For a Membership application, please go to www.ckc.ca under CKC Services and Forms On-Line). The Non-Member Participation Fee is fee paid in the calendar year (January – December) in which the dog achieved its title and/or titles.

ATTENTION FOREIGN EXHIBITORS

Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted; however, they are to be payable in Canadian funds. If you send a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please do not mark cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated. Thank You."

GENERAL INFORMATION

Judging will not commence prior to 8:00 am

These shows are outdoors. In the event of bad weather, there is no cover over the rings.

The show precincts will be a 150-foot (45m) perimeter from the exterior of the rings.

Exhibitors are requested to keep their grooming and crating areas clean and tidy.

Dogs not entered in these shows will NOT be allowed within the precincts of the show.

The Show Superintendent will be in full charge of the show, governed by CKC rules.

If, because of riot, civil disturbance, or other acts beyond the controls of the management, it is impossible to open or complete the show or trial, no refund of Entry Fees will be made.

Noteworthy Farm Show Services and Charlotte County Kennel Club will use care and diligence for the welfare of all dogs, exhibitors and spectators, but will not be responsible for, nor assume any liability in the event of accident or misfortunes however caused.

Dogs need only to arrive 15 minutes before scheduled judging time and will be excused from each show when not required for further judging. Waiting for dogs will not be possible and handlers with several breeds must arrange for alternate handlers if judging times for their breeds conflict.

GENERAL ENTRY INFORMATION

To comply with instructions issued by the Canadian Kennel Club, we will be unable to accept entries reaching the Show Secretary after the official closing date as published in this premium list.

No entry will be accepted unless all particulars called for on the entry form are shown thereon. INCOMPLETE ENTRIES WILL BE RETURNED. NO ENTRY WILL BE ACCEPTED UNLESS ACCOMPANIED BY ENTRY FEES.

TELEPHONE ENTRIES CANNOT BE ACCEPTED.

It is your responsibility to verify the receipt of any electronic entries prior to the advertised closing date.

Noteworthy Farm Show Services reserves the right to refuse any entry, subject to CKC Dog Show Rules.

Identification cards and judging schedule will be mailed / emailed as soon as possible after entries close.

Conflicts between Dog Show Rules and the New Breed Standards. The Board of Directors of the CKC, has ruled that where a conflict arises between the Breed Standards and the Dog Show Rules that the Dog Show Rules will take precedence.

Exhibitors must abide by errors made in entering their dogs regardless of how or by whom the entry was made. Changes or cancellation of any entry after closing date is prohibited.

In the event that the dog is absent, excused by a Veterinarian or Judge, disqualified, or barred from competition by action of the bench Committee, no entry fees will be refunded.

To avoid noise and confusion, there will be no individual dogs called to the ring by loudspeaker. Delays waiting for dogs will not be possible and handlers with several breeds must arrange for alternate handlers if judging times for their breeds conflict.

Only dogs eligible for registration with CKC may enter this show and trial.

Charlotte County Kennel Club reserves the right to refuse any entries, subject to CKC rules.

EVENT REGISTRATION NUMBER (ERN)

All dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events will require an Event Registration Number (ERN).

To obtain an ERN simply do the following:

1. send a photocopy of the dog's Registration Certificate reflecting current ownership, for example AKC Registration Certificate with a written request for an ERN.

2. Include with the above a cheque or money order in the amount currently required payable to the Canadian Kennel Club.

3. Ensure that you provide the CKC with your full return address to enable the ERN to be sent to you.

4. Faxed requests will be accepted. Please indicate your VISA/MasterCard number and expiry date, the card holders name and signature.

This Event Registration Number MUST be applied for within 30 days of the first day of entering a CKC event. Dogs may be entered as "LISTED", however, failure to apply for an ERN within 30 days will result in cancellation of any wins, awards or scores.

TEMPORARY COMPETITION NUMBER

(* EFFECTIVE MARCH 2, 2020) Temporary Competition Number (TCN) must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event. The same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog until the dog is permanently registered. Once a dog is permanently registered or has an ERN, the TCN will be replaced with the registration number or ERN.

A TCN cannot be used for Listed Breeds (MCN) or dogs that will require a Performance Event Number (PEN) or Canine Companion Number (CCN)

There is no fee to obtain a TCN, however exhibitors will still be required to pay TCN Fees (formerly called Listing Fees) when entering events using a TCN.

TCN Numbers may be obtained online via the CKC website where the number is issued instantly.

* Exhibitors may also mail in a printed application or contact CKC Shows and Trials by phone for a number. *

If your dog does not have a registration number or ERN and has already competed in a CKC event and earned points, scores or awards, before applying for a TCN online, exhibitors are encouraged to check their dog's profiles to determine if the CKC has already created a TCN for that dog. There will be a tab called TCN Dogs in the owner's Portal account.

A TCN is required to enter the BABY PUPPY CLASS, however, listing fees do not apply to baby puppies.

EXHIBITORS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR ENSURING THAT THEY ARE ENTERED IN THE CORRECT CLASS. PLEASE REFER TO THE CKC RULE BOOK"

CONFORMATION CLASSES

Baby Puppy A dog 4 months up to 6 months on the day of the show. **Junior Puppy** A dog 6 months up to 9 months on the day of the show. **Senior Puppy** A dog 9 months and up to 12 months on the day of the show.

12-18 Months A dog 12 months and up to 18 months on the day of the show. Canadian Bred A dog which was born in Canada.
Bred by Exhibitor A dog owned and handled by the breeder.
Open Class A dog 6 months of age or older

Specials Only Dogs who are Canadian Champions.

Championship Points

A dog awarded Winners at a conformation show shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the number of championship points credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be as provided hereunder.

The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points awarded Winners shall be as follows:

Dogs Competing 1 6 to 9 13 + 2 3 to 5 10 to 12 Points Allocated 0 1 2 3 4 5 *Includes the dog awarded Winners In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points.

If a dog awarded Winners is also awarded Best of Breed at the show, then all dogs competing in the breed, including Specials Only, shall be included in the total. If a dog awarded Winners is also awarded Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed, then all dogs of the same sex including those competing in Specials Only shall be included in the total. If a dog awarded Winners is also awarded Best of Winners, then all dogs defeated directly or indirectly in the breed shall be included in the total. If a dog is awarded Winners only, then all the dogs of the same sex in the class competition shall be included in the total. The number of championship points to be credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be determined by the highest award earned and calculated as per this section. Clarification: Example of directly or indirectly defeating: If the Winners Bitch is awarded Best of Opposite Sex but not Best of Winners, the Best of Winners Dog shall be deemed to have indirectly defeated the Specials bitches, and is thus entitled to add them to the number of dogs and bitches defeated. In addition to championship points allocated at the breed level, a dog awarded Best of Breed that also places in the regular group competition shall be credited with the following additional points provided that a dog was defeated at the group level.

A dog may not be credited with more than five (5) championship points in a single show.

Permission shall be granted a club or clubs to hold shows in such a way that any dog may earn three (3) sets of championship points on the same day, provided that one or more of those sets of points is awarded at a specialty for that breed or group. A dog awarded Winners that also places Best in Show at an all-breed conformation show shall be credited with five (5) championship points inclusive of any points earned at the breed and group level.

In order for a dog to be recognized as a champion and its owner provided with a championship certificate, the dog must: (a) earn at least 10 championship points under at least three (3) different judges; (b) be registered in the records of the CKC, have an Event Registration Number (ERN) or have a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN); (c) have earned at least one 2-point win either at the breed or group level. 15.1.13 The Board interprets the words "earn at least 10 championship points under 3 different judges" to mean: (a) Three (3) or more Winners awards at not less than three (3) different shows, under three (3) different judges at the breed level; (b) each of the three (3) judge's awards must be one or more championship points won at Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or group placing; (c) all points required for championship status may be earned at Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or group placing.

Grand Champion (GCh) The title of Grand Champion may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation championship. Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the conformation championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship. To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of two (2) wins of at least two (2) points each. Points may be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward. (a) Grand Champion Point System Points towards the Grand Champion title, are attained at breed level and are awarded to Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed winner and the number of similar-sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Bitch). The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at breed level for all levels of GCh:

(c) In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain at least two (2) points after 12 months of age. In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points.
 (d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Grand Champion Bronze (GChB) The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained. (a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship. (b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward. (c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

Grand Champion Silver (GChS) The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained. (a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze. (b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Grand Champion Gold: (GChG) The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained. (a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver. (b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Grand Champion Excellent (GChEx) The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver

Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website. To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special: (a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed) (b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty best of breed wins. (c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles, (b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, 3 Group wins, or 3 Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career. NOTE: 1. Exhibitors are required to complete the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet form located on the CKC website and forward to CKC upon completion of requirements above. 2. Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honoured up until July 1, 2022.

No dog may be brought onto the grounds or premises of an event if it:

- 1. Is known to have distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease;
- Has recovered from distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease within the last 30 days (prior to the event);
- 3. Has been housed within 30 days prior to the even on premises on which there existed distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease.

Clubs do have the right to remove a dog from the event premises and the exhibitor may be subject to disciplinary action if it is found that CKC rules have been contravened.
